

How does one become Catholic?

Most members of the Roman Catholic Church are baptized as infants. They grow up in Catholic homes, receive formal religious education and gradually come to share in the full sacramental life of the church.

Others, those who have not been previously baptized or were baptized in other Christian traditions become Catholic Christians through a process called:

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS (RCIA).

Through this process they are baptized (if needed) and receive the sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist.

Those who were baptized Catholic but need one or more of their Sacraments of Initiation, Eucharist or Confirmation may also receive them through the RCIA process.

The celebration of the sacraments of initiation takes place at Easter. The formation process begins at the end of the summer and continues past Easter.
