History of Immaculate Conception Parish

It was here in Old Town that Saint Junípero Serra celebrated his First Holy Mass in California on July 2, 1769, near the site of the present Immaculate Conception Church, and it was on the hill overlooking Old Town that he planted the cross which marked the site of the Mission and the Presidio.

In 1849, the first parish church was established in Old Town with the name of Immaculate Conception and was dedicated in 1858. It still stands and is known as the Old Adobe Chapel on Conde Street. The cornerstone to the present Immaculate Conception Church was laid in 1868 under the direction of Father Antonio Ubach. With the population swing toward the south, it was not until July 6, 1919, that the church was dedicated by Archbishop John J. Cantwell of Los Angeles.

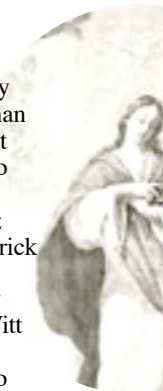

**THE REASON FOR ALL DISTURBANCE IS
THAT
NO ONE FINDS FAULT WITH HIMSELF**

FROM THE PASTOR

Saint Dorotheus, abbot

Let us examine, my brothers, how it happens that many times a person hears something unpleasant and goes away untroubled, as if he had not heard it; and yet on some occasions he is disturbed and troubled as soon as he hears such words. What is the cause of this inconsistency? Is there one reason for it or many? I recognize a number of them, and one in particular is the source of all the others. As someone has put it: Occasionally this results from the condition in which the person happens to be.

If a person is engaged in prayer or contemplation, he can easily take a rebuke from his brother and be unmoved by it. On other occasions affection toward a brother is a strong reason; love bears all things with the utmost patience. Another reason may be contempt; if a person despises the one who is trying to trouble him and acts as if he is the vilest of all creatures and considers it beneath his dignity even to look at him, or to answer him, or to mention the affront and insults to anyone else, he will not be moved by his words.

The result of this is, as I have said, that no one is disturbed or troubled if he scorns and disregards what is said. But on the other hand, it is also possible that a person will be disturbed and troubled by his brother's words, either because he is not in a good frame of mind, or because he hates his brother. There are a great number of other reasons as well. Yet the reason for all disturbance, if we look to its roots, it that no one finds fault with himself.

This is the source of all annoyance and distress. This is why we sometimes have no rest. We must not be surprised when we are rebuked by holy men. We have no other path to peace but this.

We have seen that this is true in many cases, and, in our laziness and desire for rest, we hope or believe that we have entered upon a straight path when we are impatient with everyone, and yet cannot bear to blame ourselves.

This is the way we are. It does not matter how many virtues a man may have, even if they are beyond number and limit. If he has turned from the path of self-accusation, he will never find peace. He will always be troubled himself, or else he will be a source of trouble for others and all his labors will be wasted.

ON FALSE SPIRITUAL PEACE

Saint Dorotheus, abbot

The man who finds fault with himself accepts all things cheerfully – misfortune, loss, disgrace, dishonor and any other kind of adversity. He believes that he is deserving of all these things and nothing can disturb him. No one could be more at peace than this man.

But perhaps you will offer me this objection: “Suppose my brother injures me, and on examining myself I find that I have not given him any cause. Why should I blame myself?”

Certainly if someone examines himself carefully and with fear of God, he will never find himself completely innocent. He will see that he has given some provocation by an action, a word or by his manner. If he does find that he is not guilty in any of these ways, certainly he must have injured that brother somehow at some other time. Or perhaps he has been a source of annoyance to some other brother. For this reason he deserves to endure the injury because of many other sins that he has committed on other occasions.

Someone else asks why he should accuse himself when he was sitting peacefully and quietly when a brother came upon him with an unkind or insulting word. He cannot tolerate it, and so he thinks that his anger is justified. If that brother had not approached him and said those words and upset him, he never would have sinned.

This kind of thinking is surely ridiculous and has no rational basis. For the fact that he has said anything at all in this situation breaks the cover on the passionate anger within him, which is all the more exposed by his excessive anxiety. If he wished, he would do penance. He has become like a clean, shiny grain of wheat that, when broken, is full of dirt inside.

The man who thinks that he is quiet and peaceful has within him a passion that he does not see. A brother comes up, utters some unkind word and immediately all the venom and mire that lie hidden within him are spewed out. If he wishes mercy, he must do penance, purify himself and strive to become perfect. He will see that he should have returned thanks to his brother instead of returning the injury, because his brother has proven to be an occasion of profit to him. It will not be long before he will no longer be bothered by these temptations. The more perfect he grows, the less these temptations will affect him. For the more the soul advances, the stronger and more powerful it becomes in bearing the difficulties that it meets.

SAN DIEGO – *The Most Rev. Robert McElroy, head of the Roman Catholic Diocese of San Diego, today issued the following statement concerning separate decisions by the US Supreme Court striking down legislation intended to regulate abortion in Texas, Mississippi and Wisconsin.*

“A series of decisions by the Supreme Court this week striking down abortion statutes in Texas, Mississippi and Wisconsin is another sign of the failure of our national legal and political system to protect human life at its most vulnerable. It is also an ominous signal that even the most modest legal steps to protect the life of the unborn are likely to be blocked by a judicial philosophy and political culture which effectively annihilate the human identity of the unborn child while pretending to accord presumptive recognition to the stark reality which both morality and science attest – that a preborn child is indeed a human life.

“Let us pray and work together to create a society in which children in the womb might be accorded the most fundamental human right of life which is the heritage of us all.”

AMORIS LAETITIA
ON LOVE IN THE FAMILY

19. The idyllic picture presented in Psalm 128 is not at odds with a bitter truth found throughout sacred Scripture, that is, the presence of pain, evil and violence that break up families and their communion of life and love. For good reason Christ's teaching on marriage (cf. *Mt* 19:3-9) is inserted within a dispute about divorce. The word of God constantly testifies to that sombre dimension already present at the beginning, when, through sin, the relationship of love and purity between man and woman turns into domination: "Your desire shall be for your husband, and he shall rule over you" (*Gen* 3:16).

20. This thread of suffering and bloodshed runs through numerous pages of the Bible, beginning with Cain's murder of his brother Abel. We read of the disputes between the sons and the wives of the Patriarchs Abraham, Isaac and Jacob, the tragedies and violence marking the family of David, the family problems reflected in the story of Tobias and the bitter complaint of Job: "He has put my brethren far from me... my kinsfolk and my close friends have failed me... I am repulsive to my wife, loathsome to the sons of my own mother" (*Job* 19:13-14, 17).

The Precious Value of Marriage and of the Family

3. OF MOSCOW AND ALL RUSSIA
2/12/16**

21. We call on all to respect the inalienable right to life. Millions are denied the very right to be born into the world. The blood of the unborn cries out to God (cf. Gen 4:10).

The emergence of so-called euthanasia leads elderly people and the disabled begin to feel that they are a burden on their families and on society in general.

We are also concerned about the development of biomedical reproduction technology, as the manipulation of human life represents an attack on the foundations of human existence, created in the image of God. We believe that it is our duty to recall the immutability of Christian moral principles, based on respect for the dignity of the individual called into being according to the Creator's plan.

'In Lord Jim, Joseph Conrad wrote: "...no man ever understands quite his own artful dodges to escape from the grim shadow of self-knowledge." Artful denial is a common disposition of those who will not compromise their ideology with reality, lest they be discomfited by the fact of evil.'

FANATICAL CATHOLICS

Let's just go for it, shall we? The whole world needs to be Catholic — and not just Church of Nice Catholic, but genuine authentic, real deal Catholics — fanatical Catholics. And if the term disconcerts you because society has married the adjective "fanatical" to religious crazies, like murderous Muslims, consider the reality.

Fanatical Catholics are saints. Fanatical Muslims are killers.

Mother Teresa was a fanatic. Saint Francis was a fanatic. Saint John Vianney was a fanatic. Saint John was so fanatical that Satan told him if there were four priests in the world like him, his kingdom on earth would come to an end.

Fanaticism is a holy good. It means complete devotion to the cause. The problem isn't fanaticism; it's the ideology that it's modifying.

Do you not think for one moment that radical feminism is advanced by fanatics? Same with abortion. Do you not think that Cecile Richards and the gals over at Planned Parenthood are not fanatics? Hillary Clinton, who will prove to be a more useful tool for Satan than Obama could ever have been — do you not think she is a fanatic?

There's nothing wrong with being a fanatic. In fact, there is everything wrong with *not* being a fanatic when it comes to the Faith, because your opposition is fanatical. They want your children accepting transgenderism in bathrooms and men marrying men to be a good and even holy thing. So you need to match their fanaticism, their devotion to the cause, with an even more radical fanaticism. They want the whole world to accept abortion, men having sex with men, contraception, fewer humans, environazi propaganda — all of it. They want you to not just keep quiet but convert you to accepting it, even at the point of law.

Western fanatical secularists want to force you to accept their evil at the point of jail and fines. Islamist fanatics want to force you to accept Islam at the point of the sword. Catholic fanatics want you to accept the truth at the point of your own intellect and conscience.

The problem today is there aren't enough Catholic fanatics compared to secularists and Islamists. The reason for that is the fanatic secularists and Islamists are self-centered and get their reward immediately. Saint Paul said of them, "Their God is their belly and their glory is their shame. Their minds are set on earthly things." He also said of them, "Their destiny is destruction."

This is why the world needs to be converted to Catholicism, the whole flippin' world — every last man, woman, child authentic Catholics. And before you laugh it off, consider the days long past, the days of the Roman Empire. It was converted. It was converted by fanatical Catholics who faced down fanatical pagans — and the pagans were defeated.

The same happened in Ireland, Poland and other lands of Europe.

Then it happened in Mexico and South America. Fanatical Catholics defeated fanatical pagans. And think for a moment about an authentically Catholic world. There would be no mass killings. There would be no false religions like Islam to incite disaffected young men to violence. There would be no gay bars for them to kill dozens of same-sex attracted men.

As long as the world remains not converted, these things will continue to happen. Young men will grow up thinking they are sexually attracted to other men. Other young men will grow up thinking they should kill them. Men will abandon their wives and families. Mothers will continue to kill their children. Others will continue to profit by selling little pieces of the little bodies. And clergy will continue to commit gross sins of omission by not teaching the Faith, not defending the Faith, and in many more cases than we want to face, not believing the Faith.

The world without Catholicism is a dark place — drug overdoses by the celebrated and the anonymous, pornography, murder, suicide, killing people in hospitals, adultery, abandoned children left fatherless, perverted sex raised to a right, women threatened in their own bathrooms because of ideology and so forth.

In the movie "Gladiator," the main character Maximus says to the emperor Marcus Aurelius that the world is dark. Rome is the light. He meant it in a different sense, of course, but his words are true. The Catholic faith is the light of the world and it must be carried by fanatics to the ends of the earth to convert every soul. And this isn't the opinion of a bunch of crazies at Church Militant. This is the command of the Son of God as he ascended into Heaven. "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit."

Bring them into the Church, one by one, soul by soul. Your fanaticism will be the fuel for this to happen, and the fuel for your fanaticism will be grace both freely given and merited by your charity.

One thing matters in this life and one thing only: your love for souls. If you aren't a fanatical Catholic, you should pray to be one. The world is full of fanatics of another kind, and they have you and your families and their souls squarely in their sights.
